

We love our staff!

Last school year, we conducted "Stay Interviews" to determine how we can better engage 3rd and 4th year teacher to stay with Equality longer. As a result of those interviews, we implemented the following new benefits:

- **Tuition reimbursement** for approved academic work for all staff.
- Financial Wellness tools, including an ongoing subscription to Everydollar (which is a personal budgeting app) for all staff.
- Fully paid parking in the garage for eligible teachers at our Middle School (our High School has a parking lot).

In addition, our staff continue to use and appreciate the following unique benefits:

- Telemedicine allowing prescriptions for antibiotics to be prescribed over the phone, when needed.
- Ergonomic wellness incentives— our staff are encouraged to maintain a healthy work-life balance.
- **Gym membership** reimbursement through our medical benefits.
- Free copays for children on our most popular medical benefit plan.
- All staff receive a returning bonus each year.
- Staff referral bonuses of \$750.

What's next for our graduates?

A majority of our scholars pursue post secondary education. We dream of recruiting them in the future to teach the next generation of Equality's student body.

We are proud to say that we are in our 10th year of operation and thriving. Plus, we've become a central part of our Co-Op City community.

Elementary

We are proud to say we've gotten postive praise and support for planning a future Equality elementary school. Stay tuned!

Equality's graduation rate in 2018 and 2019 surpassed our district (58%), New York City (76%) and New York State (83%). The foundation laid in our Middle School for growth continues to produce immense dividends in High School.

Step 1: Include and admit scholars as they come to us—don't counsel kids out or find reasons to expel them. We believe that treating kids like they are dragging a school down is what drags a school down—it's not the kids, it's the attitudes of the adults. We like to admit kids who need a lot of help because we like to help kids.

step 2: Focus on systematic growth—don't teach for the test and don't pay special attention to the data sets that makes us look the best. We believe that scholars who come to us with immense reading challenges can get the same success in life as scholars who come to us reading well beyond their grade level. We believe in the motto: "it's not where you've gotten to, it's how far you've come."

Step 3: Don't talk about love.

Just be stubborn about doing it.

Reem Al-Barati started at our middle school in January 2018, the middle of her 7th grade year. She is from a Yemeni family, a native Arabic speaker, and came to Equality with no English speaking abilities. In less than 1.5 years, Reem ended her 8th grade experience with a Level 2 on ELA, a Level 3 on Math, and an Expanding Level on the NYSESLAT. It is gratifying to share that Reem is also the first girl in her immediate family to continue her formal education past 8th grade, a process that involved our ELL teacher's frequent communications with her parents about her academic talents and potential. We are thrilled to see Reem in the halls and classrooms of our high school this year. We know her future is bright!

Scholar Profiles

We celebrate that each scholar has unique talents, needs, goals and challenges; Moreover, we stand in awe of the beauty of their growth on different paths.

Matai Calander started at Equality as a 6th grade scholar. He came to us already having repeated one grade level and was over-aged. He struggled behaviorally throughout middle and high school. In his junior year, Matai, his parents, and school administration agreed that continuing at Equality was not the best choice for him. With the continued support of our staff, he earned his high school equivalency. He is now studying welding at BCC. He was the honored speaker at our school's 10 year celebration along with his sister, who graduated Equality in 2018 and currently attends New York Institute of Technology.


